#### **Short Description**

This course addresses questions surrounding the history of Zionism and contemporary Israel. Central to these are the origins of Zionism a European national liberation movement embedded in the Middle East; The history of the mandate years between colonialism and national conflict; and the emergence of the "New Jew" cultural ideal. This course seeks to answer such questions through a broad and deep analysis that spans the 19th and 20th centuries, pays close attention to Israel's social and cultural composition and politics, and imbeds modern Israel into the global context. Following the historical introduction, the second half of the course deals with contemporary Israel focusing in particular on its social tensions and cultural dilemmas, like minorities, gender, feminism, ethnic tensions and globalization. We explore a variety of sources ranging from communication, literature and political thought to Middle East and Jewish Studies.
