Short Description

This course will explore contemporary multimedia depictions of monsters and mythological creatures, discussing how iconic monsters such as vampires and ghosts have been translated into the Digital Age. What effect has the advent of the Internet and online spaces had on popular portrayals of zombies or werewolves? And, most importantly, what new monsters and metaphors have been created to express modern anxieties?

Final grade components

Minor assignments:

1 short response paper (1-2 pages), can be submitted at any point during the semester. **25% of final grade.**

Midterm:

In-class exam. 15% of final grade.

Final requirement:

Paper. 50% of final grade.

Participation:

10% of final grade.
