Short Description

The course will introduce students to various models of coping with loss. The importance of meaning in the face of death will be discussed in depth, with a focus on dimensions of mourning, from Sigmund Freud's ideas to Shimshon Rubin's Two-Track Model of bereavement. Students will be encouraged to share mourning rituals, highlighting diverse cultures and the common psychological principals underlying them.

Final grade components

Midterm:

Mandatory. Essay. 25%.

Final requirement:

Mandatory. Take-home exam, for which students have 48 hours for preparation and submission. 55%.

Participation:

Participation, 20%, includes:

- 1. Commitment to keep phones off during class;
- 2. No eating during class;
- 3. No gum chewing;
- 4. No surfing the web (unless instructed otherwise by the lecturer);
- 5. No checking messages via laptops.
- 6. Contributing to discussions in class is mandatory.

Attendance

Attendance is mandatory. Students are permitted a maximum of three unauthorized absences without penalty. Any additional absences will affect the final grade and may result in failure of the course.*

Final assignment

Late papers will be subject to a point deduction.*
