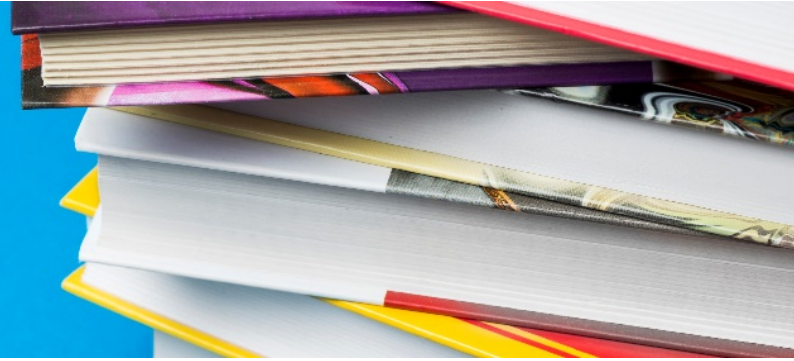

Short Description

This course is an introduction to Social Psychology. We will delve into seminal theories and case studies in the field. Topics covered will include (but are not limited to): The science of Social Psychology, problematic group dynamics, biases, social conflict, small-group interaction, decision making, attitudes, and social perception.

Students will be asked to complete a multiple-choice midterm exam and to submit a final paper.

Final grade components

Class participation and attendance: It is expected that all students will complete assigned readings and be active participants in class discussions. All class readings can be found on the course Moodle.

Midterm multiple-choice exam (19% of final course grade): Students will be asked to complete a multiple choice and short answer exam.

Final Paper (81% of final course grade): Please evaluate a social psychology case study which will apply terms and theories reviews in class. 6 pages, bibliography not included.

Attendance

Attendance is mandatory. Students are permitted a maximum of three absences without penalty. Any additional absences will affect the final grade and may result in failure of the course.

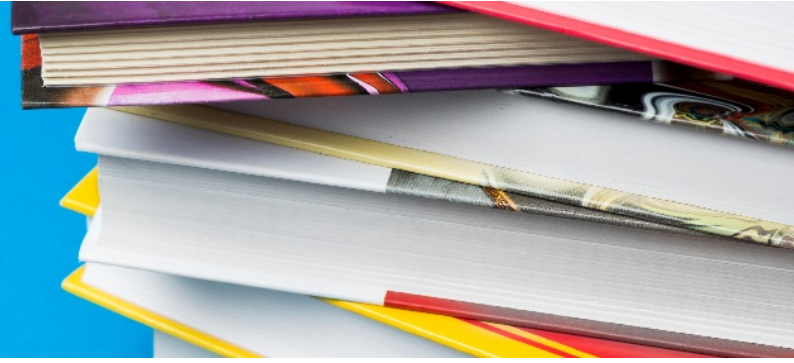
Academic Conduct
