#### **Short Description**

This seminar exposes students to the theoretical and practical aspects of developing environmentally aware solutions to sustainability challenges. The solutions will be formulated using holistic life cycle perspectives that take into account production and consumption systems. The course addresses selected issues that affect everyday life and examines whether and how environmental and social issues can be taken into account in providing solutions to future challenges. The course includes theoretical lessons and examples from the field as well as a practical activity component in order to increase students' awareness of environmental considerations and of the complexity in developing solutions to real problems.

Status presentations on project progress every 3 weeks and in the final session – 20%

One homework assignment on the theoretical materials – 15%

Final deliverable submission of the project – 40%
